Dear Judge Scarola:

As Your Honor is aware this office represents the interests of the Lakewood Township Board of Education/Lakewood School District ("Board" and/or "District") in connection with the above-referenced matter.

In furtherance of our previous submissions and arguments presented, we, again, simply state, ALL agree that the Lakewood Township Board of Education is not adequately funded and that the current State funding formula does not allow the Lakewood Township Board of Education to provide a "Thorough and Efficient" ("T&E") education to its ever growing public school population that consists of

precious children who according to mandatory reporting requirements consist of more than nine-four percent (94%) minority students, all of whom qualify for “free and reduced” lunch, have a myriad of *individualized* needs that one does not encounter in a majority of school district's in Ocean County, or, let alone the State of New Jersey.

Candidly, I am not even sure why the parties continue to litigate and exhaust their efforts in a dueling match *instead of* merely reporting to the legislature the proven and acknowledged need to provide a permanent and stable solution not continuous last minute “fixes” that have occurred yearly and belatedly to the detriment of all since 20185.

In the Matter of The Borough of Freehold, 2015 WL 1435123 wherein the Commissioner accepted the recommended findings that the school district therein was severely overcrowded with same adversely affecting the students ability to receive a “Thorough and Efficient” (“T&E”) education, herein, numerous Commissioners (plural) of Education and Treasury have accepted the **F-A-C-T** that Lakewood Township Public School District requires millions of dollars of loans to provide a “T&E” education to its students.

Specifically, as Your Honor surely recalls *only after the undersigned* served an OPRA request upon the New Jersey Department of Education (“NJDOE”) on September 25, 2018 (**EXHIBIT “A”**) the District learned that, in fact, *since 2015* the State has been providing millions of dollars of

Loans not as a “favor” and/or due to “politics” but solely, as the Departments of Education and Treasury clearly and meaningfully document to provide a “T&E” education to Lakewood Public School students (**EXHIBIT “B”**).

Your Honor previously noted that this F-A-C-T in Your DECISION/ORDER denying the Department’s request for Summary Judgement, and, respectfully, should be enough to end this frivolous litigation, as there is no dispute as to the District’s need for a stable and current funding formula.

In addition, the *very individuals* employed by the New Jersey Department of Education (“NJDOE”), albeit, statutorily paid for by the District to supervise the finances of the District, to wit, the *State Monitors* themselves (Michael Azzara and David Shafter) have testified, stated, and *continue* to assert *as of today* that the Lakewood School District does not have any sort of spending “problem” and/or inappropriate actions, BUT, a revenue problem that sorely requires a “fix” other than more loans *much akin to a “ponzy scheme”*.

Moreover, lest anyone forget Loans and/or Grants are *only* legal and can only be provided to the Lakewood Township Public School District if the State Monitors and their “bosses” (i.e., the State/NJDOE) agree that the District took all steps required, did not inappropriately expend funds, and were in dire need of additional monies, **N.J.S.A.**



The Department finds that this advance payment is necessary to ensure the provision of a thorough and efficient education. *

→ The Lakewood School District will have an estimated deficit of \$12,031,986 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016. The total deficit includes \$2,952,396 budgetary deficit for the year ending June 30, 2015 and an estimated deficit for the current school year of \$9,079,590. The cause of the current year deficit is an estimated over expenditure of \$7,263,934 in regular transportation and aid in lieu accounts, \$1,402,237 in special education transportation accounts and a \$1,503,412 over expenditure in tuition accounts. This is offset by a \$1,000,000 grant from Lakewood Township for non-mandated transportation not included in the original budget and \$89,993 in excess of budgets in other local revenue lines and extraordinary aid.

The district's total deficit of \$12,031,986 includes an over expenditure of funds for courtesy busing for the current year. The amount requested for the advance of state aid of \$5,640,183 does not include the over expenditure for courtesy busing and will not be used to offset such costs.

Due to the amount of the advance and its impact on local taxpayers, I recommend a ten-year term for repayment. The first repayment installment of \$852,267.80 will be due in the 2018-2019 school year. Upon approval and issuance of the advance, this repayment will be

effectuated by the Department through automatic deductions in the state aid provided to the school district. At this time, there is no recommendation for the assessment of interest. We can discuss this further and may determine to impose interest on the unpaid balance in the future pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:7A-56(h).

Please note that Lakewood is considered eligible for funding pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A.18A:7A-55 and as such may be approved for an advance in State aid to be repaid with a term of repayment not to exceed 10 years.

This payment shall be considered a loan according to the provisions of the law as specified above. Your request for a 10-year term of repayment has been approved, with repayment to be made through automatic deductions to the State aid provided to the school district, beginning in the 2018-2019 school year.
